accordance with the Department of State idelines, all of our host families are volunteers at willingly provide the following for the udents:

A bed with a frame and mattress Meals whenever the student is in the home Some transportation for extracurricular activities

hat happens if hosting does not ork out?

ETUSA is committed to being your partner in osting before, during, and after your exchange udent returns home. We have procedures and ocesses in place to address any and all nallenges that may come up while your student with you. We also have a 24/7 emergency line railable to you.

hat is the screening process for the change students?

I of our students must pass extensive English mmunication testing. They also must provide hool transcripts that show they have a C rerage or higher. We also have full medical aluations as part of the screening.

an we travel with our exchange udent?

es! CETUSA loves when a host family travels ith their exchange student. We do have ocedures in order to keep both student and ost family safe at all times.

HOST FAMILY

Can I host more than one student at a time?

You can host a maximum of 2 exchange students at the same time, as long as they do not speak the same mother language.

What type of family can host an exchange student?

CETUSA host families come in all shapes and sizes. We have two parent homes with or without children, single parents, single, young families, empty nesters, same sex parents, and any other kind of family dynamic. We ask that our host families have a big heart that are willing to welcome a student far from home.

How long do exchange students come to America for?

CETUSA has exchange students that come for a semester -- July/August to December/January, December/January to May/June.

We also have exchange students that come for a full academic year -- July/August to May/June.

What countries does CETUSA partner with?

CETUSA works with overseas organizations from over 25 countries. We have students comfrom Europe, Asia, South America, Pacific Islands, and Africa.
